

GENERAL INFORMATION

Parental Responsibilities

Parents are expected to support and reinforce the school rules and policies.

The school expects parents to attend Orientations, Parents-Teacher Meetings, and school functions as per the schedule communicated to them, and thus show their interest in their child's school activities.

a) Visits to School

As part of the School Security system, all parents visiting the school must follow the school security protocol as laid down from time to time. Parents must display their parent ID card while in school.

Parents are not allowed to meet students during the class hours, only in case of emergency with the appropriate permission of the principal, it can be allowed.

b) Communication between School and Parents

Parents are expected to immediately communicate to the school any change in the address and contact details.

Parents wishing to meet with the school Management and administrative staff are requested to seek an appointment by either mentioning the reason in the school Diary of the student or by telephoning the reception. Parents should not come to premises during the school days unless it is with a prior appointment or in cases of emergencies.

The desirous of meeting the teachers can do so after school hours between 4:05 pm to 4:30 pm. Monday to Friday.

Parents are requested to ensure that the name, class and section of the students are mentioned in all communication addressed to school.

If any parents are found interfering directly or indirectly with the administration of the school, it reserves the right to remove the names of their children from the rolls of the school.

c) School and Home

Partnership between teachers and parents is vital for a good education.

The influence of home and family plays a bigger part than what is learnt in the school, and that the role of the parents in a child's development is as important as that of school. Mahabodhi School counts on the support of parents in its commitment to do the best for its students.

We look to parents to provide a healthy and cheerful home environment, encourage thoughtfulness, tolerance, and responsibility, and foster good social conduct.

d) Parents and Student complaint Procedure:

We provide opportunities for students and parents to express their concerns and are always accessible to them. A culture of open communication and discussion-based approach to resolve matters has been established. In general, it is best for learning relationship if the concern/issue can be resolved amicably through discussions between the student/parents and/with the appropriate member of staff. However, if these fail then a formal procedure will be enacted.

- Formal Complaint: If an informal discussion does not result in satisfactory resolution, the student/parent may file a formal complaint. The complaint should include a clear description of the issue, the individuals involved, and any supporting evidence or documentation in writing and submitted to the School Management.
- Review by Management: Upon receiving the recommended actions, the management will interview the matter which may involve gathering additional information, interviewing witness, and consulting with relevant parties. Then they will decide based on the information gathered and take appropriate action.
- Resolution: Following the investigation, the school will work the involved parties to find a resolution to the complaint. The resolution will be fair, reasonable, and in accordance with the school's policies and procedures. The decision of the management is final.

e) School Fees Payment

Parents must take the responsibility of paying the fees on time. Timely payment of fees is crucial for the smooth functioning of the school.

Fess will be accepted in the school office from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm on all working days (Monday to Friday) and on Saturday between 9:00 am to 12:30 pm. Fees can be paid through QR Scan also.

Parents failing to pay the fees on time will be issued notice from the school. If the payment is not done after issuing the notice, then the management will forward the names of the parents to B.E.O and D.D.P.I directed by the D.C for further action.

SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

General

- 1. There is one fundamental school rule, which is that all students at all times will behave well and sensibly and show courtesy, consideration, and respect for others, and do nothing that will bring the school's name into disrepute. All the students will strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the school.
- 2. The school reserves the right to make changes in the school rules and regulations, which will be communicated to students and parents.
- 3. The school hours are as follows:

Monday to Friday: 9:20 am to 4:05 pm

Saturday: 8:20 am to 12:40 pm

Students must arrive 10 minutes before the school time. The gates will be closed exactly at 9:20 am. Those who arrive after the bell will not be allowed to attend classes and mark absent for that day.

- 4. Students should not bring any valuables to school. School will not be responsible for the loss of any personal valuables.
- 5. No library books will be issued unless the students produce their identity card.
- 6. Students who expect to return home late from school must inform their parents in advance.
- 7. Every student should bring the school Diary daily to the school.
- 8. Students are required to participate in all school activities unless excused by the appropriate faculty or management, in response to a written request from parent/guardian.
- 9. All the students must come in full uniform set (with tie, ID card, belt and proper grooming). Without proper uniform student will be sent back home.
- 10. The school May at its discretion, use photographs, films or work of students made in the school or during school activities and trips.

Conduct

- 11. All students are required to behave courteously at all times, conform to the norms of good conduct and respond readily and cheerfully to requests concerning good order and discipline that may be made from time to time by teachers.
- 12. All students must be scrupulously honest in their academic studies.
- 13. Students should keep the campus free of litter.
- 14. The school will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour by students, such as overt public display of affection or using obscene or vulgar language.
- 15. All students are expected to be regular and punctual in their attendance at school, including games and sports.
- 16. No student is expected to indulge in any act of misbehaviour or disrespect to teachers both in and out of the school.
- 17. Students are to be very regular to school. Attendance on the opening and closing days of each term is very essential. Students, who do not have the minimum required attendance, will not be promoted to next class.
- 18. Students should remain within the school campus during school hours and not venture out on any pretext. Adequate snacks and stationery should be brought.
- 19. Students must keep their classroom and surroundings clean and not litter.
- 20. All tests and evaluations are compulsory and exemption from evaluations will not be considered unless on medical grounds supported with proper evidence.
- 21. Discipline and good behaviour should be maintained inside the school van and bus.
- 22. Those who are absent themselves for long period of time without any reason whatsoever will have their names stuck off the rolls. Such students may be considered for readmission provided they fulfil the formalities for new admission.
- 23. Mobile phones, cameras, radios, or any other gadgets are strictly prohibited inside the school premises. CD/pen drive may be brought only if they have been asked by any teacher. And long leave for weddings of family members, family functions etc., during the school term will not be granted.
- 24. Our students are expected to speak only in English right from the moment they enter the school premises and inside the school van and bus.
- 25. A minimum of 80% attendance for each term is compulsory.

Discipline

- 26. Students found indulging in any form of malpractice in connection with any exam session will be dealt with strictly. This will include awarding of zero marks for the subject, along with suspension, possibly leading to expulsion from school.
- 27. Students must not bring dangerous, disruptive, or anti-social implements such as guns, knives, catapults, explosives, laser pens, etc./to school. The school has a 'zero tolerate' policy with respect to possession of such implements.
 - Violation of this policy will be subject to severe disciplinary action, which may include expulsion from the school.
- 28. The school has 'zero tolerate' policy in respect of possession, supply or use of illegal drugs, narcotic substances, tobacco, e-cigarettes, alcohol, or any other socially unacceptable substances both in school, on school trips, or in any public space. Any student found to be violating this policy will be subject to strict disciplinary action, which may include expulsion from the school.
- 29. Any incident of trading/gambling including playing cards, video games, in school/ on buses/ on school trips is prohibited. Any student found to be violating this policy will be subject to severe disciplinary action which may include suspension from the school.
- 30. The school has 'zero tolerance' policy towards any form of bullying, including ragging and electronic abuse. Any student found in indulging in such practice will be subject to strict disciplinary action which may include expulsion from the school.
- 31. Vandalism of any kind will be subject to disciplinary action. Students guilty of wilful damage will be punished and charged for any necessary repairs/ replacements. In cases of group vandalism where individuals cannot be identified, the charge will be levied on all students known to be present during the vandalism.

Every student shares the responsibility of informing the administrative office / Management should they see others violating the above-mentioned policies.

Dress and Appearance

- 32. Students are expected to dress and behave in a manner appropriate to the expectations of the school and are required to be neat and clean in their general appearance.
- 33. Students are also not allowed to wear any expensive ornaments.
- 34. The school uniform must be washed and ironed. Must wear clean socks and black shoes. On Wednesday and Saturday clean track suit should be worn.
- 35. Girls should have their hair plaited with blue ribbons. Hair should not fall on the forehead.
- 36. Nails should be trimmed regularly. Nail polish and make-up should not be used.
- 37. No jewellery is allowed.
- 38. Boy's shirts are required to be tucked into the pants at all times.
- 39. Boys should have their hair cut short and be clean shaven.
- 40. Simple colour cloths may wear on Birthday.

Attendance and Punctuality

Parents are requested to see that his/her child attend school every day. Whenever a student remains absent, parents must write and send all leave note in the school diary.

- a) If the student remains absent from school due to some extraordinary circumstances, parents should meet the principal and inform immediately.
- b) A doctor certificate is required for absences due to illness for three or more days.
- c) A student must have 80% attendance for promotion to next class. No leaves will be granted on telephone. Half day attendance is not allowed.
- d) Parents should not take their children home before the end of the school hours.

School Uniform

- 1. Each pupil should be equipped with a minimum of two sets of uniform.
- 2. All uniforms must conform to the prescribed pattern and colour shade specified by the school.
- 3. Students are permitted to wear only one-inch-wide light brown belt provided by the school.
- 4. Students of all class must be very neatly dressed and sport a short hair style.
